Weather in Italy

Spring (March–May): Best Gelato Weather

- Temperature: 55–70°F (13–21°C)
- Vibe: Sunny but fresh, with flowers blooming everywhere.
- Highlights: Perfect for strolling Bologna's arcades, selfies in Verona, and gondola rides in Venice.
- Packing Tips: Light layers, comfy sneakers, and a jacket for surprise showers.

Summer (June–August): Sun + Supercars

- Temperature: 70–85°F (21–29°C), hotter inland.
- Vibe: Bright, busy, and buzzing with tourists.
- Highlights: Factory tours at Ferrari, Ducati, and Lamborghini feel extra epic, plus evening concerts in Venice.
- Packing Tips: Sunglasses, breathable clothes, refillable water bottle, and sunscreen for long walking tours.

Fall (September–November): Golden Selfies Season

- Temperature: 60–75°F (16–24°C) early fall, cooler later.
- Vibe: Crisp air, golden light, fewer crowds.
- Highlights: Food adventures at FICO, golden sunsets in Verona, and cozy canal walks in Venice.
- Packing Tips: Layers, light rain jacket, and shoes that can handle cobblestones.

Winter (December–February): Venice in Moody Mode

- Temperature: 45–60°F (7–16°C)
- Vibe: Quiet streets, misty canals, and cozy museums.
- Highlights: Smaller crowds mean more space to explore, plus atmospheric concerts and indoor workshops.
- Packing Tips: Warm layers, waterproof coat, scarf, and sturdy shoes for wet piazzas.

Cultural Tips

Language & Courtesy

- Learn a few Italian basics: Buongiorno (Good morning), Per favore (Please), Grazie (Thank you), Arrivederci (Goodbye).
- Use polite tone and formal greetings, especially with elders or professionals.
- Saying goodbye when leaving shops or museums is appreciated.

Pace of Life

- Embrace slower rhythms: meals are savored, conversations linger, and schedules may flex.
- Expect midday closures (1–4 PM) in smaller towns.

Food & Dining

- Bologna is famous for rich pasta dishes like tagliatelle al ragù and stuffed tortellini, Verona highlights hearty fare such as risotto all'Amarone and pearà sauce with boiled meats, while Venice is known for seafood-based dishes like sarde in saor and risotto al nero di seppia.
- Dining is social - wait to be seated, don't rush, and avoid substitutions unless necessary.

Respect for Nature & Heritage

- Stay on marked trails, greet fellow hikers, and keep noise to a minimum.
- Be mindful in historic areas: no littering, respectful photography, and quiet behavior.

Student Engagement

- Curiosity is welcomed—locals enjoy sharing stories with respectful students.
- Dress modestly for formal visits (churches, research centers).

Faith & Tradition

- Catholic heritage is visible in daily life - shrines, bells, and traditions.
- Sunday is sacred: many businesses close or slow down. Use this time for reflection or scenic walks.

Flavors That Teach and Inspire

For students and curious travelers, food in Emilia-Romagna and Veneto becomes a living textbook of culture, science, and tradition. Each dish reflects centuries of innovation — from Bologna's mastery of pasta and cured meats to Verona's wine-infused risottos and Venice's lagoon-born seafood. Culinary experiences here reveal how geography, history, and craftsmanship shape identity: the fertile plains of Emilia-Romagna yield rich sauces and cheeses, while the waterways of Venice inspire delicate seafood and artisanal glass. As students taste, they're not just enjoying a meal — they're participating in a dialogue between people, place, and the STEM principles that underpin agriculture, preservation, and design.

1. **Tagliatelle al Ragù (Bolognese)** – Bologna's signature dish: fresh egg pasta ribbons with a slow-cooked meat sauce, hearty and nuanced.
2. **Tortellini in Brodo** – Tiny, hand-folded pasta filled with meat or cheese, served in rich broth, a symbol of Bologna's culinary artistry.
3. **Mortadella di Bologna** – The original mortadella, delicately spiced and smooth, often sliced thin or cubed as a savory snack.
4. **Risotto all'Amarone (Verona)** – Creamy risotto infused with Amarone wine, showcasing the city's deep connection to viticulture.
5. **Lesso con la Pearà (Verona)** – Boiled meats paired with a peppery breadcrumb sauce, a rustic specialty rooted in tradition.
6. **Sarde in Saor (Venice)** – Sweet-and-sour marinated sardines with onions and raisins, balancing preservation techniques with flavor.
7. **Risotto al Nero di Seppia (Venice)** – Risotto cooked with cuttlefish ink, a striking black dish that blends science and artistry.
8. **Baccalà Mantecato (Venice)** – Creamed salted cod spread on bread, a Venetian staple that highlights preservation and texture.
9. **Pandoro (Verona)** – A star-shaped golden cake, especially popular at Christmas, symbolizing Verona's sweet traditions.
10. **Tiramisu (Veneto)** – Espresso-soaked ladyfingers layered with mascarpone cream and cocoa, a dessert born in the region and beloved worldwide.

Entry Requirements

Italy and other EU Schengen Area entry requirements include having a passport valid for at least three months after your departure date, proof of sufficient funds and accommodation, and proof of onward travel. U.S. citizens must also register with the EU's new [Entry and Exit System \(EES\)](#) upon entry for stays up to 90 days and require an [ETIAS authorization](#).

For Non-EU Citizens

- **Passport:** Must be valid for at least three months beyond your intended departure date from the Schengen Area.
- **Purpose of Stay:** You must provide proof of accommodation and sufficient financial means.
- **Return/Onward Travel:** You must prove your intent to return to your country of origin or travel to a third country.

- **EU Entry & Exit System (EES):** From October 2025, U.S. citizens will need to provide fingerprints, a facial image, and passport details for stays of up to 90 days in any 180-day period.
- **[European Travel Information and Authorization System \(ETIAS\)](#):** U.S. citizens will also need to obtain ETIAS authorization online before traveling to any Schengen country.

For EU/EEA/Swiss Citizens

- **Travel Document:** A valid passport or national identity card is sufficient.
- **Stays Over 90 Days:** You must register at the local City Hall (Ufficio Anagrafe).

General Requirements (for all visitors)

- **Purpose:** Document your purpose for visiting and show you have sufficient funds for your stay.
- **No SIS Alert:** You must not be subject to an alert for being refused entry into the Schengen Information System.
